

PP Kareem French provided an update on Zone 34 structure, initiatives and activities including World Cleanup Day and Arbor Day. He elaborated on his role as DRR.


# District 7030 Update DRR Mario

# RCOB Donation Drive to The Dominican Association of Barbados Food Drive - 18th September


