**SUMMARY OF THE BUSINESS MEETING HELD ON
FEBRUARY 17, 2022**

- President Robin called the 32nd meeting of the Rotary Year to order at 12:30 p.m. This was followed by the National Anthem and Toast to the President of Barbados.
- Today's prayer was offered by Rtn. Simone
- SAA Randy introduced visiting Rotarians and guests
- Pres Robin congratulated PP Jedder and Rtn Sanjay on their attainment of the PHF+1 designation
- Pres Robin announced the Birthdays and Anniversaries which are detailed on page 4A
- Rtn Steve delivered the Rotary Minute which was centred on the various vehicles by which The Rotary Foundation recognized individual contributions
- Rtn. Keri introduced the guest speaker: Mr Miles Weeks to address the club on the topic of "Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) - Legal Ways to Resolve Disputes Other than Court"
- ADR is a viable alternative to the traditional means of conflict resolution: litigation in a court of law
- There are 3 main methods of ADR using a third party neutral:
 - ⇒ Arbitration
 - ⇒ Adjudication
 - ⇒ Mediation
- There are International Laws and Conventions which validate the recognition and enforcement of ADR. There are also 3 Local Laws governing this process
- ADR is generally recognized as more expeditious than the traditional legal litigation process
- A vigorous and informative Q & A session ensued including comments from some club members who are members of the legal fraternity
- PP Stanley delivered the Vote of Thanks.
- Pres Robin advised the club that the Hilton was prepared to make 5 dates available for in-person luncheon meetings between now and Jun 30. A survey has been sent around to members via electronic means to determine the level of interest that members have in taking up this offer. An immediate response was requested, although some members had indicated non-receipt of the survey. Dir. Savitri committed to having it re-sent.
- Pres Robin reminded the club of the Founders Day church service scheduled for Sunday, Feb 27th at St Dominic's Roman Catholic Church at 10:30 a.m. There are 140 spaces available for us to attend, and while there are no restrictions we are still required to register our attendance. Those interested are asked to provide their names to Sec Ermine by Wed, Feb 24
- Pres Robin thanked those who had settled their dues but reminded us that there is still a long way to go to reduce the substantial outstandings to an acceptable level
- Next week the club will be addressed by Mr Ronald Pope on the subject "Why Suicide?"
- SAA Randy exacted his customary fines and in recognition of Valentine's Day delivered a poem and a virtual rose to the female members of the club
- Attendance was 64%
- The meeting was adjourned at 1:40 p.m.
