Mr. Leslie graduated from the University of the West Indies with an honours degree in Civil Engineering and immediately began working as a design engineer with Maycocks Associates Inc. - a structural engineering firm.

While this job afforded him the opportunity to work on a number of interesting construction projects in Barbados and around the region, he decided to make a drastic career shift and joined the Barbados Water Authority in 1995.

His career with the BWA progressively advanced from this time until the present with him holding positions of increasing responsibility.

In 2002, Mr. Leslie took a short break to complete a Master's of Science degree in Water Resources Management & Technology at Birmingham University.

He has over 24 years of experience in the development, planning, design/build and oversight of municipal water and wastewater related infrastructure.

Most recently, Mr. Leslie led a team to successfully complete the Three Pipeline (Ionics) Project as well as package "A" of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) Mains Replacement Project on time and on budget.

Married for over 17 years he has one daughter Celina. His hobbies are cycling and gardening.

A unique feature was noticed with these three speakers. They were all introduced to the Club by Past President Lionel A. Moe who was sitting at the head table showing a terse smile of admiration.

In his General Remarks President Jeddler reminded members of the need to register for the upcoming District Conference; being the fine hosts, a reputation we have garnered over the years.

He also asked for volunteers to assist with the International Fair on April 9

Treasurer Elect Joel Brathwaite spoke of Rotary being an extension of his Pastoral Duties. He saw this service as an opportunity to give without seeking reward - as some of the persons helped could not repay you. He described it as the ability to "look beyond self" to help others.

He encouraged members to seek to add value as we made our several contributions within the community.

He reminisced on the reasons for being "Fined." (I guess as incoming Treasure this will be of importance to him)

Rotarian Joel Brathwaite joined the Club on July 21, 2006. His Classification is Communications—Postal Services. He was introduced to the Club by PP Lionel A. Moe. He has served as a member of the Club Bulletin Committee 2007-2011, Drug Awareness & Environment 2011-2012. For 2012-2013 he served on the Children's Homes and Environment sub-committees and for 2014-15 Vocational Service, Environment sub-committees. For 2015-16 he is the Chair of the Vocational Services Committee



Past President Jerry spoke of the two areas which in his view are paramount: Service and Fellowship. He recounted his early days of Service and giving back through the Sunday School at Dalkeith Methodist Church and the Boy's Scouts - "Bob a Job" Days.

He recalled the influence of his father who was a member of the Jaycees and a founding member of the Kiwanis in Barbados.

He spoke of not only giving money but time- the ability to physically help persons out of their difficult situations.

He related his preference for projects which were "hands on" such as Challenor School, Boviev and the Evalina Smith Children's Ward, which also provided for excellent fellowship. He challenged

us to identify projects which provided the opportunity for physical work, such as painting and de-bushing. Exemplifying What Rotary Means to Us—showing Service Above Self!
