# Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on July 18<sup>th</sup>, 2024

#### **RCOB Meeting Minutes July 18, 2024**

- President Arlene called the meeting to order at 12:30 pm
- Club members sang the National Anthem which was followed by the saying of the Rotary Grace and then a toast was made to the President of Barbados
- S-A-A Peter welcomed all and indicated that there were no guests to be introduced
- President Arlene announced 2 major items on the agenda: Classification Speech of Rotarian Rachel Power and the pinning of a PHF

#### Rotarian Rachel Power's Classification Speech

Rotarian Rachel indicated that she currently serves as a Financial Manager of a Private Villa. Born and raised in Barbados, she was not particularly passionate about numbers in her formative years as she was more of a creative soul with a bit of an entrepreneurial spirit. She loved art, piano and being in the kitchen with her mom, from whom she believed her entrepreneurial spirit was developed as her mom baked and catered to make extra money. Shining shoes, baking and ironing clothes were just some of the entrepreneurial activities she undertook during her childhood, always seeking ways to earn and learn.

After secondary school, she attended the Barbados Community College, pursuing an Associate Degree in Computer Science. Although Accounting was part of the curriculum, she did not enjoy it and actually failed in those subjects, having to repeat exams and take summer classes and barely passing them even then. She moved on to the University of the West Indies with no clear direction with the Accounting and Finance fields the furthest things from her mind. She started a degree in Management but later switched to Accounting, intent on challenging herself following her previous experiences. Overcoming this challenge became a turning point for her and during her last summer at UWI she started in the banking sector, working as a teller and in personal banking gaining knowledge about financial management and customer service, which then motivated her to help people manage their finances better. On completing UWI she had the opportunity to work as an Accounting Officer for a small group of companies which included a small hotel. She then went on to further her studies in Accounting at the London School of Business and Finance. Upon return from London, jobs were not as readily available as expected so she leaned on her entrepreneurial spirit, and started her first business providing bookkeeping services for small businesses. She also partnered in starting a small contractor business specializing in property management before eventually

landing a job as an Accounting and Office Administrator at EcoBreeze, which allowed her to blend her creativity with Accounting as she was mixing paints, advising on colours, flooring and roofing for home and commercial design. She held Accounting roles in various other sectors such as Manufacturing, Oil and Gas, Hospitality and International Business, allowing her to dive deep into financial reporting and compliance and hone her skills in budgeting, financial analysis, inventory management and payroll administration. This journey also provided her the exposure to operations management at a local coffee manufacturer, a role thoroughly enjoyed as a proud coffee snob. Here she leaned on her creative side, planning events and Tastings simultaneously enhancing her people management skills. She then took her talents to UNNA Luxury Resorts as an Accountant for a short while before becoming a victim of job loss resulting from the Covid pandemic. However, she reverted to her entrepreneurial mindset, branching out in the catering business - an incredibly rewarding and learning experience.

When the world returned to some semblance of normalcy, she started working as an Accounting and Client services Administrator at Centralis, an international business. There, she provided management, administrative, and accounting services to a diverse client base, including multinationals engaged in intra-group lending, holding companies, and financing vehicles. She then moved on to the current role as Financial Manager at a luxury Private Villa, overseeing the financial and administrative side of the business ensuring guest satisfaction, employee productivity and operational efficiency. For her, the most rewarding part of the job is seeing the positive impact of her efforts on the businesses. Improving financial performance and operational efficiency is extremely satisfying notwithstanding the challenges of cleanup and ensuring accounts are up to standard.

With ethics being the backbone of Accounting and Finance, transparency, integrity, and accuracy are thereby fundamental to her practice. Being a member of the Rotary Club reinforces these values, serving as a reminder of the importance of service and ethical conduct in all of her professional endeavours. Success in finance requires strong analytical and communication skills, with emphasis on attention to detail while staying adaptable and proactive, especially in a rapidly changing economic landscape. An entrepreneurial mindset and the ability to work both independently and as part of a team are also essential. Constant learning, growing and adapting is paramount when navigating the ever-changing business environment especially as it relates to providing the best service to clients and staying ahead in the industry.
