
 Mr. Michael Anthony Young, whose service is to all ages in the community via the sport of



GUEST SPEAKER: Today we thank and welcome Ms. Octavia Gibson who has kindly accepted our invitation to address our club on issues relating to Counterfeit funds / money and Mr. Alvon Moore both of whom are employed at the Central Bank of Barbados.

Ms. Octavia Gibson joined the Central Bank of Barbados on December 29, 1975. Between 1975 and 2005, she worked in several departments in the Bank Including Foreign Exchange, Banking, Accounts, Currency, Bank Supervision, Internal Audit and the Projects Unit.

Between 1998 and 2004, she spearheaded the Y2K Project, the RTGS and ACH projects for the Bank and the financial sector.

In 2007, she was seconded to set up the Barbados Deposit Insurance Corporation and managed that entity until the appointment of its first CEO. Presently Deputy Director, Currency, having been appointed to that post in 2005, she has been leading the Currency Team in a number of firsts including:

- Exhibition of world currencies
- Development of a royalty programme for numismatic coins
- Changeover to different materials for our coins
- Introduction of a new banknote series
- The One Cent Charity Drive done in association with the Rotary Club of Barbados, South and the Alzheimer's Association.
- Withdrawal of the one cent
- Revamping of the Know Your Money Programme

She is highly trained in counterfeit detection and prevention and in the skill of designing bank notes.

Banking aside, Ms. Gibson is an involved community person herself whose involvement ranges from netball at a global level and being in the choir at Beulah Methodist Church .

We also welcome with Ms. Gibson , Mr. Alvon Moore who is the Senior Operations Officer in the Currency Department of the Central Bank of Barbados. Alvon joined the Currency Department in April, 2013 and his direct responsibilities include general supervision of vault operations, preparation of Currency budgets, notes forecasting and management of relationships between the Central Bank's Currency Department and treasury operations of Commercial Banks. Since joining the Currency Department he has the technical lead for responsibility for various projects including; Withdrawal of One Cents Coins from Circulation, the Scraping of Mutilated Coins, Installation of New Notes Processor and Implementation of an Enterprise Cash Management Software in the Currency Department.

He holds a BSc Economics from the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus and a MSc Finance and Business Economics, from the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus
