On this Day of National Significance in our Season of Emancipation, we will be honouring Mr. Stephen O'Malley UN Resident Coordinator who has been very instrumental in the Model United Nations (MUN) programme over the past years.

Mr. Stephen O'Malley, UN Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative for Barbados and the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States, assumed his post in August 2013. Before this assignment, he spent 12 years in the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) in the UN Secretariat in New York. His last post was as Deputy Director, Coordination and Response Division from March 2013 until August 2013. From 2008-2013, he was Chief, Central Emergency Response Fund Secretariat, and from 2001-2008, he served in a variety of roles in OCHA related to southern and central Africa. Prior to joining OCHA, Stephen spent seven years with the non-governmental organization Médecins sans Frontières in North America, Europe and Africa.

Our other specially invited guests today are PDG David and PDG Milton, the Presidents of the other two Rotary Clubs and the Directors of the other two Rotary Clubs who were involved in MUN.

DISTRICT 7030 NEWS UPDATE

DG Dominque Véneré during a recent interview, entitled "Dialogue with our DG Dominique", has indicated that during her year she hopes to show an image of Rotary that inspires people who hesitate to join our Rotary family to join. She notes that the values that motivate us have enabled Rotarians for 113 years to help our communities using our skills and expertise in the six priority areas we have. Together with the bond of friendship and fellowship which unites members of this large family, permits us to set up bridges and find quick solutions.

DG Dominique noted the fragility of the Southern Caribbean given hurricanes and earthquakes.

She also noted that notwithstanding independence, the region still has problems with sanitation, health such as obesity, diabetes, sickle cell disease, illiteracy, all of which can benefit from the Rotary Clubs of the Region.

In short, DG Dominique is in her dialogue inspiring us as

Rotarians to be an inspiration for others so that they too can join our clubs and offer critical assistance to those in need.

Recap: July 19 2018—Fellowship Meeting

Immediate Past President Paul recapped his experience at the recently concluded Rotary International Convention and encouraged other members who attended to share some of their personal experiences. For PP Paul, it was his first International Convention and a very enriching experience.

PP Paul was very impressed with the way in which the logistics were handled. Although there were over 25,000 attendees and it was held in two venues, everything was accessible. He spoke about the excellent organization and pointed out that the registration ID which could have been collected at the airport allowed free metro transport. PP Paul highlighted that the topics were all very timely and the speakers were of a very high caliber. Speakers included Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal, Princess Anne, who thanked Rotary for taking a central role in working to eradicate polio; former first lady of the United States Laura Bush who challenged Rotarians to keep early childhood education a priority; Helen Clark, former Prime Minister of New Zealand and one of the architects of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals who discussed gender equality and the link between the environment, poverty, hunger, and peace; Haitian Prime Minister Jack Guy Lafontant who spoke before the announcement of the creation of HANWASH, a collaboration between Rotary and the Haitian government to tackle that nation's water and sanitation challenges; and Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, who accepted Rotary's Polio Eradication Champion Award. Other high level speakers mentioned by PP Paul were Caryl M. Stern, President and CEO of UNICEF USA whose parents fled Europe as wartime refugees and Jim Marggraff the co-founder of LeapFrog and a Rotarian, who has partnered with Rotary to use the tablet designed by his company to teach Afghan women literacy skills.

Another area noted by PP Paul was the level of involvement of Rotaractors and the way in which they were treated as partners. He said that we do a good job of including our Rotaractors, and we should continue the excellent fellowship with D7030 and D7020 with organized activities. PP Paul also suggested that there is a need to improve the booth for the Districts to better showcase the Caribbean flavor in the House of Friendship.

Rtn. Heather shared her experience as a volunteer Sergeant-At-Arms which afforded her a different type of experience to interact on a one-on-one basis with Rotarians assisting them with whatever information they needed. PP Brenda and PP Erskine spoke of the great experience of Home Hospitality and PP Brenda suggested that the Barbados contingent should take along small Barbados flags. PP Erskine and Secretary Neal spoke Of their interesting contacts with Rotarians and the exchange of information and Club banners. They have committed to mailing out their banners and both presented the collected banners to President Shawn.


