Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on October 19th, 2023

President Ermine welcomed Rotarians and Guests to the 13th Meeting of the Rotary Year 2023-24. The special guests were Messrs. Christopher Gibbs, MP and Chairman and Stuart Layne, CEO both of the Barbados Tourism Investment Inc, (BTII). The anthem was sung followed by a Toast to the President of Barbados. The Rotary Grace was said, and Sarge Heather Tull invited members to welcome the specially invited and other Guests.

President Ermine reminded that the development of the Tourism and Manufacturing in Barbados had contributed to the birth of the RCOB. Founder member Paul Foster, as Manager of The Barbados Tourist Board (now the BTA) and Mr. Tom Mc. Laughlin, Manager of The Barbados Development Board (now BIDC) started Rotary in Barbados in 1962. She noted that at that time many visiting Rotarians and Business visitors queried whether there was a Rotary Club in Barbados.

Rotarian Davina Layne formally invited Mr. Stuart Layne to address the club on the topic: "Economic Development Projects / Business Opportunities in Barbados". She introduced Mr. Layne, CPA (Canada), recipient of a Master's Degree in Public Administration and a Certificate in Policy and Management, both from Harvard University. Permanent Secretary (Tourism) in the Ministry of Tourism and International Transport 2000, President, and CEO of BTA 2004, CEO of BTII 2009. He played a critical role in the preparation of the Tourism Development Act 2002–2007. Presently working on over BDS\$1.0 billion in hotel and other tourism development projects including Sam Lord's Hotel, recently opened on October 12, 2023.



Mr. Layne's PowerPoint presentation, though visually handicapped by strong daylight from the windows of the restaurant, was highly informative and interesting as he covered the topic with intimate knowledge and free style presentation. (The entire presentation may be downloaded by members from the link below). In summary he discussed the Vision, Mission, Goals and Objectives of the BTI and

listed the projects being completed between 2023 - 2026:

Wyndham Grand, Sam Lord's Castle Indigo (old Caribbee Site) Hyatt Ziva Royalton (old Discovery Bay site) Pendry – Six Men's, St Peter
