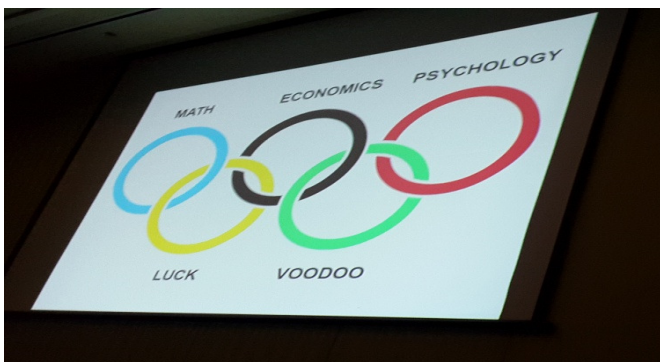

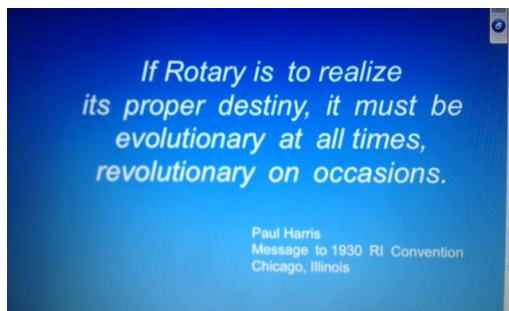
CLASSIFICATION TALKS FOR TODAY:
