

<u>Biography of Reverend Dr. John Rogers — Guest Speaker</u>

Reverend Rogers received his primary education in St. Kitts and his secondary education at the Lodge School in Barbados.
His tertiary education started at the University of the West Indies, where he obtained the following degrees: B.Sc.- Natural Sciences (Hons), B.A.-Theology (Hons) & M. Philosophy-Theology.



 He also obtained a Ph.D.-Theology (Old Testament) from the University of Birmingham in the U.K.
 He was ordained Deacon in 2001 and Priest in 2003. Between 2006 and 2015, he lectured on the Old Testament at Codrington College.

His other achievements are as follows:

- 2015 Leader of Bible Study at the Provincial Synod of the Church in the Province of the West Indies in Barbados. Led several retreats and Bible Studies throughout the Province of the West Indies.
- 2016 Leader of Bible Study at USPG Annual Conference in Derby, UK.
- 2017 Speaker at the USPG "Rethinking Mission" Conference in London, UK.
- 2018-2021 Independent Senator in the Parliament of Barbados
- 2020 Appointed by the Archbishop of Canterbury to be a member of the Inter Anglican Commission on Unity, Faith and Order.
- 2021 Appointed to the Inter Anglican Standing Committee of Unity, Faith and Order (IASCUFO) of the Anglican Communion.

In 2009, Dr Rogers published a book on the topic "Faith of Our Fathers: The Development of the Apostles' Creed".

Reverend Rogers is currently the Rural Dean of St. John's Deanery and Rector of St. George Parish Church.

He is married and has a daughter.

Dr Rogers is well qualified to speak to us on the topic – "The Role of Religion in Barbados". Please join me in welcoming Rev Dr John Rogers.

Rotary help saved the lives of Albinos in Tanzania. Hunted for body parts and isolated by fear, Tanzanians with albinism find safe futures with the help of Rotary.

Over the years the superstitions that albino body parts bring good luck or fortune have contributed to a wave of grisly killings.

Body parts were offered for sale at 75,000 Shilling in the Capital, The per capital income of Tanzania is 1,000.

Headed by a local Rotarian Community Advocate who is also an albino, campaign for the right per of people with albinism which are often misunderstood. With the assistance of Tanzania based Rotarians and two global grants "Vision Aids and Albinism Awareness to Children in Tanzania" the lives are changing for the better. Under Vision Aid grant, optometrists from Scotland train local optometry students.



Rotary grants support community events to educate people with albinism i Tanzania.

Students are supported with mattresses, mosquito nets, vision aids, hats, and sunscreen, and financed livelihood building projects in remote communities. Rotary also focuses on cancer prevention and treatment through training health workers and providing specialized medical equipment.

In the area of business, Rotary has financed the purchase of compressors, sewing machines and microloans to small associations, which consist of family members with albinism.

Attitudes of fear and rejection towards albinos are increasingly less common, since the election of 3 albinos to the Tanzania Parliament.


