Guest Speaker Dr. Arthur Phillips



Dr Phillips has been employed by the Ministry of Health and Wellness for several years as a clinician and a public health administrator. Arthur is also an Associate Lecturer with the University of the West Indies.

Arthur Phillips obtained his medical degree from UWI, Cave Hill. He has Masters degrees in Public Health and in Health Economics and Health Policy both from the University of Birmingham, in the United Kingdom. As Associate Lecturer in Public Health, Arthur contributes to the Bachelors of Health Science and to the Social and Preventive Medicine component of the Medical degree. His areas of interest are Economic Evaluation and Non-Communicable Diseases.

From April 2020 Arthur worked as Deputy Chair of Health Emergency Operations Committee for COVID. He was part of a group that received the Gold Award of Achievement in April 2021 for contribution to the national COVID-19 effort, receiving a National Award (Gold Award of Achievement 2021 for this contribution).

Since October 2017 Arthur has been assigned to the post of Senior Medical Officer of Health responsible for the Non-Communicable Diseases Programme of the Ministry of Health and Wellness. This role includes oversight for the work of the Health Promotion Unit, the National Nutrition Centre and the Advisory and Inspection Committee. Additionally, it includes responsibility for advising and oversight of National NCD Programme and supporting the work of the National multi-sectoral Non-Communicable Disease Commission and the Task Force on Wellness.

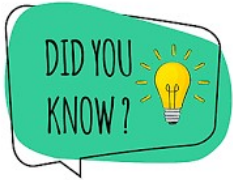

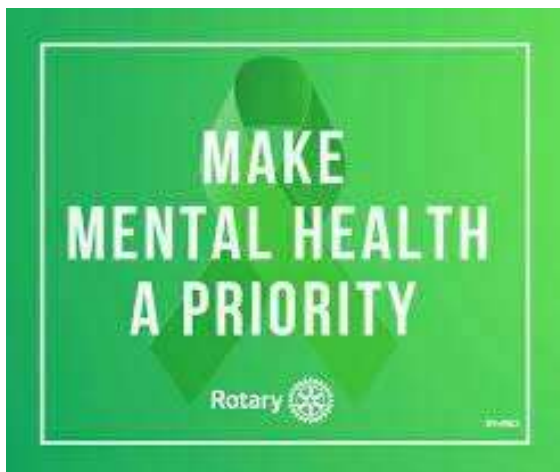

- Rotary was the vision of one man, Paul Harris, a Chicago attorney.
- The Rotary Club of Chicago was formed on February 23, 1905 with the aim of attracting professionals from diverse backgrounds to exchange ideas and form meaningful and lifelong friendships.
- In 1907, The Rotary Club of Chicago's first project was to equip Chicago with public toilets, thereby improving sanitation in the city.
- The 2nd Rotary club to be formed was The Rotary Club of San Francisco in November 1908.
- The first Rotary Convention was held in Chicago in 1910.
- The first issue of the "The Rotarian Magazine" was issued in January 1911.
- At the 1911 convention the motto of "Service Above Self" was adopted.
- In 1912, Rotary became an international organization with the chartering of the Rotary Club of Winnipeg, Manitoba. As a result, the organization changed its name to International Association of Rotary Clubs; subsequently adopting the name Rotary International in 1922.
- The chartering of the first European club was in London, UK in August of the same year.
- In 1917, the then President Arch Klumph proposed establishing an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world", which was the precursor for the creation of the Rotary Foundation.
- The first donation of \$26.50 was made by the Rotary Club of Kansas City.
- In 1928, the RI Foundation was formally named and the Board of Trustees were elected
