Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on October 20th, 2022 - Theme - End Polio Now

Today we celebrated the Work of Rotary and other agencies to eradicate Polio. World Polio Day is celebrated on October 24. We were asked to wear RED

- 1. Acting President PP Elvin Sealy welcomed us to meeting #12
- 2. The National Anthem was led by PP Jedder
- 3. A Toast to the President of Barbados
- 4. The Rotary Grace was jointly said by the Gathering.
- 5. Sergeant at Arms Randy introduced the Guests and Visiting Rotarians. Special welcome was made to President Roger Bynoe and his partner Margot, who were celebrating their 50th Anniversary of Marriage
- 6. International Chair PP Carole presented the "Rotary International/Foundation Minute" on "Eradication of Polio".
- 7. SAA Randy disciplined the Club. He commended those who supported the Call to wear Red. Even though some of the purported Red did not pass the Color Test. The PP in Red Shoes was highlighted for his special effort.

Rotary International/Foundation Minute





Since 1985, Rotary International has been at the forefront of efforts to eradicate Poliomyelitis (more commonly known as Polio), from every corner of the world.

Polio can strike people of any age but mainly affects very young children by invading the nervous system. Potentially fatal, polio can cause total paralysis in hours, and once contracted, is not curable.

In 2021 there were only two countries where polio was still endemic – Pakistan and Afghanistan – and even in these locations, aggressive vaccination efforts have dropped the number of cases to a handful a year.

The first case of polio in this hemisphere in the last three decades was reported on July 21, 2022 in a young unvaccinated man in New York City. The Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA) issued an alert on July 27, 2022 to residents of Barbados and other Caribbean states, regarding the reemergence of polio.

RI President Jennifer Jones encourages all members to support efforts to eradicate polio by joining a PolioPlus Society.

In recognition of World Polio Day 2022, we are invited and encouraged to support the Countdown to History and become a member of the District 7030 PolioPlus Society. To become a member all you need to do is commit to making an annual donation of US \$100 (or more) to The Rotary Foundation's PolioPlus Fund until such time that Polio is completely eradicated and the World Health Organization certifies the world free of Polio.

For your contribution and annual commitment, you will receive a District 7030 PolioPlus Society certificate and an exclusive PolioPlus Society pin, which will be sent to your Club President for presentation at a club meeting or event during the 2022-2023 Rotary year.
