RECAP OF OUR SEP. 21 2017 MEETING WHEN WE CELEBRATED INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE.

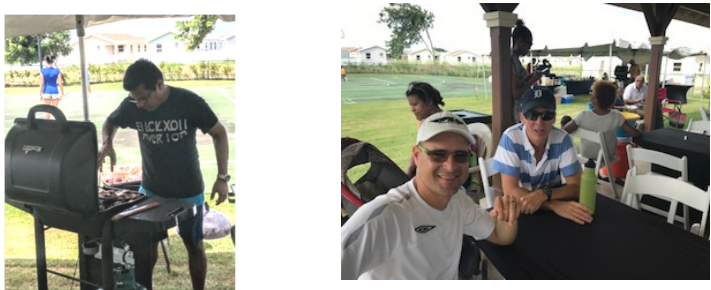
