## **RECAP OF AUGUST 22 – FELLOWSHIP MEETING**

At last week's fellowship meeting our guest speaker was Senator Alphea Wiggins who has been appointed as the Prime Minister's envoy to serve in Suriname.

Senator Wiggins spoke about the various ways in which Suriname and Barbados will be collaborating and forming a synergistic relationship. Some of the areas she mentioned were: 1) investment opportunities; 2) scientific collaboration; 3) people to people exchanges; 4) Agriculture and food security.

Senator Wiggins was also accompanied by Chief Agricultural Officer, Lennox Chandler whom she described as her technical advisor on agriculture related matters.

As always, the club participated and asked several questions relating to access between Suriname and Barbados, the possible language barrier, and general concerns as to whether Barbados was able to fill the cargo boats on their way back to Suriname.

Rtn. Chrispin was the acting SAA and he used the opportunity to quiz the club on collective nouns; it was certainly a learning experience.

Director Makonem reminded members of the "Pass the Mic" session on Investment and financial planning which was scheduled for Saturday August 24 and Pres Peter also reminded members to go out to complete a paint job at the School House for Special Needs on that same Saturday.

#### THE BROKOPONDO PROGRAMME FOR COOPERATION 2018-2021

#### BACKGROUND

The official visit to Suriname by the Prime Minister of Barbados, the Honourable Mia Amor Mottley, Q.C, M.P follows on from her bilateral talks with the President of the Republic of Suriname, H.E. Désiré "Dési" Bouterse, in the margins of the 39<sup>th</sup> Regular Meeting of the Heads of Government of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM).

**The Brokopondo Programme for Cooperation 2018-2021** was signed on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of November 2018. In order to operationalise this programme, a delegation led by the Prime Minister's **Special Envoy** to Suriname, Senator Alphea Wiggins, visited the country along with Terry Bascombe, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Dr. Lennox Chandler, Chief Agricultural Officer and Mrs. Sandra Gittens, Senior Foreign Service Officer, Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

This visit has served to strengthen the bi-lateral relations between Barbados and the Republic of Suriname. **The Brokopondo Project** also has the potential to strengthen regional co-operation especially on food security.

During the visit we met with The President, H.E. Dési Bouterse, several Government Ministers as well as members of the Private sector and the Suriname Chamber of Commerce. A number of possible areas of cooperation and collaboration was discussed. Food security for Barbados is a major component of this project/mission.

The Barbados/Suriname project in Agriculture has 3 components: Trading in agricultural produce. Utilisation of lands in Suriname for farming by Barbadians. Scientific assistance/collaboration.

During discussions, the following areas of trading were addressed: Sale of rice to Barbados Sale of bananas and pineapples to Barbados Export of fish to Barbados Export of duck meat to Barbados Export of cassava and in what form Collaboration on Barbados breeding programme

There is a rich history between Barbados and Suriname. The author Matthew Parker brings this history into sharp focus in his book, Willoughby Land. The Landmark in Barbados is Lord Willoughby Tavern.

The work continues by Senator Wiggins in Suriname and Barbados where discussions are ongoing for functional cooperation across many ministries.
