A Children's Christmas party was another of Carole's pet projects. Carole transferred to RCOB in 2017.



## Rotary Foundation Minute July 29, 2021

- Today's minute is about the origin of the Rotary Foundation
- "It seems eminently proper that we should accept ENDOW-MENTS for the purpose of doing good in the world"
- These are the words uttered by outgoing Rotary International Arch Klumph at the June 1927 Rotary Convention in Atlanta, Georgia.
  - The idea of an endowment fund planted the seed for establishment of the Rotary Foundation.
  - ◆ The Endowment was starting in 1917 with a donation of \$26.50
  - ♦ Current donations now exceed \$1 Billon
- In 1928, the Rotary Foundation formally received its name and trustees were appointed.
- RI Past President Arch Klumph is considered as the architect of the Rotary Foundation.



## Biography Dr. Kishore Shallow— Today's Guest Speak

Dr. Kishore Shallow is a Vincentian entrepreneur, with expertise in Business Management and Information Technology. He holds a Doctorate in Business Administration from Walden University, with concentration in Finance. Dr. Shallow firstly pursued a BSc (Hons)



in Applied Business Computing from the University of Sunderland, followed by an MBA from the University of Wales Institute, Cardiff (UK).

In 2014, at age 30, he became the youngest president of any national cricket association in the region. In 2019, he was elected as president of Windward Islands Cricket Board, which was few months after becoming the youngest ever Vice President for Cricket West Indies.

Prior to cricket administrator, Dr. Shallow played competitive cricket including youth representation for St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Windward Islands. He also was a member of the first CCC team to participate in a regional tournament, Red Stripe cup in Jamaica in 2002. Dr. Shallow up to 2012 represented St. Vincent and the Grenadines senior team with the likes of Sunil Ambris (on debut).

Dr. Kishore Shallow has been a prominent voice for young people across the Caribbean for the last 12 years. He has served as a CARICOM Youth Ambassador and Vice Dean of the CARICOM Youth Ambassadors Corp. Dr. Shallow was also a member of the CARICOM Marijuana Commission, which was mandated by the Heads of Government in the region to conduct a rigorous enquiry into the social, economic, health and legal issues surrounding marijuana use in the Caribbean.

For the last six years, Dr. Shallow has been a consultant to the Ministry of Health, Barbados in an ongoing project to computerize the public health care system. He is also co-owner and Business Director of a School Management Software geared to improve the efficiency of managing students records. ## **MEET ROTARY'S NEW PRESIDENT**

Shekhar Mehta (pictured right), a member of the Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar, has been a Rotarian since 1985. He trained as an accountant and founded a real estate development company, Skyline Group, which he also chairs. But his professional title tells only a small part of the story of who he is. He is also a director of the India arm of Operation Eyesight Universal, a Canada-based nonprofit focused on preventing avoida-



ble blindness. He helped establish more than 15 eye hospitals, in several Indian states, that together carry out nearly 50,000 surgeries each year. And he started Saving Little Hearts, a project that has facilitated more than 2,500 heart surgeries for children from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, and some African countries and that is now an India-wide program.

As you'll read in these pages, he also has been actively involved in disaster relief work. Among other undertakings, he helped build 500 homes in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands after the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami.

At the International Assembly this year, Shekhar talked about how he and some fellow Rotarians decided to start a local version of ShelterBox, a Rotarian-founded organization based in the UK. "We named it Shelter Kit and put 52 items of daily need in a large trunk," he told the incoming district governors. "Over the last 15 years, in every major disaster in India, Indian Rotarians have volunteered to bring Shelter Kits to areas struck by disasters." The program already has served about 75,000 people. Shekhar also served on the ShelterBox board of trustees.

And he is also the architect of the TEACH program, which aims to do nothing less than end illiteracy in India. (You'll read more about this ambitious program in a future issue.)

Although Shekhar is skilled in the business arts, he prefers to engage his other fluencies. He told me that, after so much studying and reading during his career, he now favors learning by talking to people. He added, "I hate accounting." It all follows his belief that we would do well to think from our hearts as much as our minds.
