PDG David introduced our guest speaker Rtn. Ramesh Ferris who is a Polio Survivor.

Ramesh is a very passionate advocate in polio eradication efforts. Rtn. Ramesh Ferris gave a presentation on his experience with polio.

Rtn. Ferris contracted polio as a young child in his birthplace India. His family did not have access to the polio vaccine, or the means to pay for treatments and surgeries. His mother selflessly gave him up for adoption to a Canadian founded orphanage, Families for Children. Shortly after his arrival into Canada he underwent numerous surgeries that eventually allowed him to walk with the assistance of

braces for the first time at age 4. In 2002, Ramesh returned to India to meet his birth mother for the first time as an adult, giving him a glimpse into what life could have been like, were it not for his adoption. This trip provided the inspiration for his decision to em-



bark on a major awareness campaign with the assistance of Rotary, community leaders, proud Yukoners, and other polio survivors to hand-cycle more than 7000 kms across Canada over the course of nearly 6 months. Since his 2008 cross Canada campaign Ramesh has continued to help finish the job of eradicating polio by advocating

all over the world, personally sharing his message with many prominent world leaders.




