TODAY IS A FELLOWSHIP MEETING

THEME: ROTARY SERVING HUMANITY

RECAP OF SEPTEMBER 22, 2016

At the meeting President Lisa presented to the Club the signature project for her year. Summary of the project has been provided in previous bulletins issued in the month of September. Please see below extracts of the reports of the Directors as at today's date. These reports were previously presented to the Club both by way of an update at the Club Forum and formally at the Fellowship meeting on September 8, 2016.

Community Service Director's report (delivered by Rtn. Commander Willie Kirton for Director Annie Bertrand). He reported that there was an ongoing review of the Children's home projects which has led to the initiative "Programme for Community Reintegration" the broad objectives of which were to develop adolescents' aspirations for an appropriate career path and inspire them to become good and productive citizens. With respect to the Environment, the Committee's thrust for the Rotary Year will be on Awareness and education of caring for the environments through the formulation of an outreach programme to sensitive the community. The Annual beach cleanup was included in the presentation and was held on September 17.

Vocational Service—Director Winston Warren— He confirmed that the Club was finalizing the winners of the Pride of Workmanship Awards. It was agreed that given our involvement in the Geriatric Hospital and Children's Homes, the winners would be selected from among the Caregivers of these homes. In addition, the Club has embarked upon a customer service training program and in keeping with the signature project will assist in vocational training for tier 2 and 3 students from the Mental Health Project.

Youth Service Director—Neal Griffith and delivered by Dir. Winston teaming up with Youth Services. The Directors stated that the decision was made for a Director to visit each youth club along with a Rotarian(s) with specific business or professional experience. Those Rotarians will share with the Rotaractors, leadership and other skills necessary to further develop them into tomorrow's leaders. In addition, the Club was advised that we must build on the support shown by the Rotaractors to last year's MUN by engaging them to actively assist with any planning or the execution of MUN this year.

Club Service Director—Director Diana Douglin set out the objectives for the Club for the current year namely—efficient and effective functioning of the Club with productive, well attended club meetings; a successful public relations program—internally by continued effective publications of the Bulletin and externally and an increase in member engagement and increase in membership.

International Service Director—PP Elvin Sealy. He reminded us that international service comprises those activities that members do to advance international understanding, goodwill, and peace by fostering acquaintance with people of other countries, their cultures, customs, accomplishments, aspirations, and problems, through reading and correspondence and through cooperation in

all club activities and projects designed to help people in other lands. PP Elvin reminded the Club that contributions may be made to the Foundation; District and Global Grants. Partnerships in funding Projects and Club Activities/ Projects: MUN, Sea Wheel Chairs, Disaster Relief, Medical Assistance. Attendance at the Conferences/ Conventions, District Conferences, Port of Spain 2017, Atlanta 2017, Toronto 2018 was strongly encouraged and advised.

WELCOME TO OUR NEWEST ROTARIAN: On Sep. 22 Rtn. Peter Arender was inducted to the Club. Mr. Arender is a Financial Advisor and brings to the Club a wealth of knowledge in the area of investments and financial planning. Mr. Arender has already helped the Club by way of a well researched presentation on financial diligence presented to the Rotaract Club. He also assisted in the annual Beach Cleanup. He was introduced by PE Paul who proudly watches as Peter is duly pinned by President Lisa.

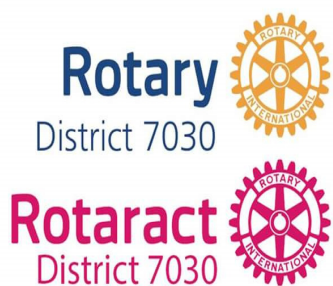

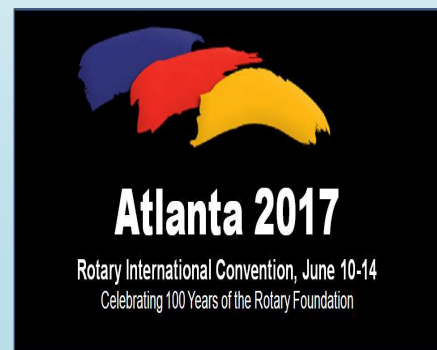
