Rotarians, our task is to impact the next generation of world leaders. I believe that is attainable when we put our hearts and minds together. We can accomplish great things. Your success in the eradication of Polio globally is particularly personal to me. Together we see a World where people unite and take action to create lasting changes; in our communities, homes and in ourselves. Practice the secret of adjustment as we get older, we become frustrated with life and some go into states of depression, even suicide, from which 1 person dies every 40 secs. Health issues show up. Sexual prowess moves from 3am to 6am and becomes a secret... It is critical to have regular prostate and blood pressure checks. The career challenges, retirement looms, the fear the unknown. Would you donate a Kidney?

Kidney failure is taking a toll on many Barbadians who have to set aside up to 4 hours three times a week for dialysis treatment. This also impacts their families, friends and work colleagues. One year of dialysis can cost over US\$75,000 according to information from the U.S. Renal Data System. With over 300 persons on dialysis, the cost to our national health system is astounding.

There is an option. Kidney transplant!

However, only transplants involving living donors are presently permitted in Barbados. Thankfully, the Government of Barbados will soon be introducing legislation to allow organ donation after death. While this is welcomed, Barbadians must be informed about the life-saving nature of organ donation and how they can become a donor.

The Rotary Club of Barbados will be playing its part through an awareness initiative. The campaign is being supported by the team from Red Advertising and will be done in collaboration with the QEH and the Ministry of Health. Our Club will be able to draw on similar awareness campaigns run by Rotary clubs around the world. An example from Rotary in India is shown below.

Our guests on Thursday, February 13 will be Dr. Margaret O'Shea, transplant surgeon, and Dr. Nerissa Jurawan, nephrologist at the QEH. Dr. Jurawan will speak to us about the programme at the QEH. We look forward to your attendance.
