Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on March 23rd, 2023

The *de facto* SAA Randy then proceeded to reorganize the seating arrangements to maximize the fellowship aspect by having an effective co-mingling of resident and visiting Rotarians and guests.

Luncheon attendees were then invited to join the buffet table in the customary manner.

Upon completion of the meal, the formal proceedings of the meeting commenced with a resident Rotarian at each table being asked to introduce a visitor at their table and provide some details about them, which had been gleaned from the fellowship activities undertaken over lunch.


