### ATTENDANCE AND MAKE UPS



Today's rotary moment has been given by Rtn. Clifford Clarke and deals with the issue of attendance and make ups.

With the words "Rotary is a participatory organization which highly values regular attendance. Being present at the weekly meetings is considered a vital part of the

organisation and success of a strong and active club" Rtn. Clifford gave a highly informative discussion on attendance and make ups. Key points to note for all Rotarians:

• Each Rotarian must attend or make up at least 50% of the regular weekly Club meetings

• Attendance is required at RCOB club meetings for at least 30% per half year

• During each meeting (eg. Per Thursday) you must remain for at least 60% of the time

• Where a Rotarian is absent, then it is incumbent on that Rotarian to do a make up either in the island or while travelling

• Make ups can be realized by attending an Interact or Rotaract meeting or by attending a District Conference or RI Convention

• Make ups must be done within 14 days before or after the regular time of the meeting

• Where the member is overseas for business for longer than 14 days, then the make up time is extended.

- There are certain acceptable excuses or absences. E.g.
  - health reasons
    - community service


