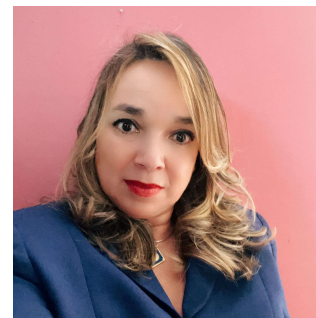

Topic: Membership and Club Development

Key points:

- Membership numbers over the 14 districts and 11 countries Carmen oversees have dwindled slightly
- RCOB is steadily growing in membership numbers and retaining members:
 - a) 2019- 79 members
 - b) 2020- 88 members
 - c) 2021- 90 members
 - d) 2022- 89 members
 - e) 2023- 104 members
- The percentage of female membership:
 - a) Worldwide- 26%
 - b) RCOB- 34.6 %

- Age Range:
 - Under 40 years old- 20.2 %
 - Under 50- 39.4 %
 - (6 members with no age range)
- RCOB Membership:
 - Satellite Club- 11 members
 - Rotaract- 2 members
 - Interact- 3 members
 - Earlyact- 2 programs
