Thursday May 24, 2018 was the day of the National Elections. Both acting SAA Peter Arender and SAA Chrispen Hackett entertained the club with their witty extemporisations. After acting SAA Peter welcomed the guests and visiting Rotarians he asked the club to raise a racket to welcome Chrispin Hackett. SAA Chrispin poetically dubbed the day "day of the Exes". According to SAA Chrispen nationally, it was an exceptional day of extraordinary excitement, exhilaration, expectation and excruciating exasperation. Then he expeditiously extorted excessive fines from the club.

Our special guest was visiting Rotarian Gregory Gustafson from Rotary Club of Champaign West, Illinois. Greg, whose designation is Engineering, shared with the club his experience of working on a water and sewerage project for an Orphanage in Honduras which entailed among other things, the laying of over three miles of water pipe to supplement the existing system and the erection of cottages. Greg was also very happy to share that one of the students from that Orphanage had just successfully completed college.

Our members were very interested and asked several questions.

President Paul asked Greg about how his club first identified the project in Honduras and Greg explained that the need first came to their attention through Engineers Without Borders.

Rtn Sanjay said that while he was familiar with Doctors Without Borders he was not familiar with Engineers Without Borders and asked Greg to explain a bit more. Greg explained that both concepts were similar and that the Engineers without Borders is a great opportunity for Engineering students to get "Real World" experience.

PP Brenda asked about the size of the project, how many students were involved and PDG David asked about how the project was funded. Greg explained that it was a small orphanage and that the project was funded mainly through the support of his club and a Rotary Club in Iowa and that the local clubs fund was also matched with a grant.



Lisa R Cummins is the Immediate Past President of our Rotary Club. She is the current Executive Director of LUMIN Consulting (Formerly UWI Consulting Company).



PP Lisa is also former Executive Director of the Barbados Coalition of Service Industries and a former Diplomat. During her 10 year diplomatic career she worked at the Headquarters of the Barbados Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade, and in the Barbados Embassy in Washington D.C. She also served as Trade Advisor for the Commonwealth Secretariat to the Government of Uganda and the Wider African region. She has worked on projects in East and Southern Africa for several development partners including the World Bank, UNCTAD, the EU and Trade Mark East Africa.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS:

Rotary wins Best Nonprofit Act for its polio eradication work.

Rotary's commitment to eradicating polio worldwide won Best Nonprofit Act in the Hero Awards of the One Billion Acts of Peace campaign, an international global citizens' movement to tackle the world's most important issues.

The campaign is an initiative of PeaceJam Foundation and is led by 14 Nobel Peace Prize laureates, including the Dalai Lama, Desmond Tutu, and Rigoberta Menchú Tum, with the ambitious goal of inspiring a billion acts of peace by 2020.

Each year, the campaign picks two finalists in each of six categories for their work to make a measurable impact in one of the 10 areas considered most important by the Nobel laureates. Winners are chosen by people from around the world.

Rotary and Mercy Corps were the two finalists in the Best Nonprofit Act category. Rotary and the five other winners will be recognized at a ceremony on June in Monaco. Betty Williams, who won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1977 for her advocacy for peace in Northern Ireland, will present the award.

We take action globally – Each year our members pour their passion, integrity, and intelligence into competing projects that have a lasting impact. We persevere until we deliver real, lasting solutions.
