- □ **COMMUNITY GRANTS-** Chair <u>Lynn Wood</u>. This committee meets once or twice a year to review the applications from local organizations submitted from February 1-March 15 each year. Our club awards 6- \$500 scholarships to local organizations.
- **CAMP ROTAMER** Chair Mick Gilbertson. Camp Rotamer is a day camp owned by the club. We have a camp director that runs it for us. It is often rented by service organizations or for weddings, class reunions, or other gatherings. We typically have two annual work days when members are asked to help out if possible: one to open the camp in the spring and one to close the camp in the fall. The Camp Rotamer Committee meets about once a month to discuss things like maintenance to the building.
- CORN ROAST & MUD VOLLEYBALL- Chair Dan Drozdowicz.. This is a very large event that takes place on the third Saturday of August each year. There is typically one or two lead Chair persons that oversee the event. There are a variety of sub chairs that make sure all areas of the event run smoothly. There is a huge need for volunteers at this event including the Friday before the event and the Sunday after. Rotarians are expected to make their best effort at being a part of this annual fundraiser. The committee usually starts
