Past President and Community Service Chair **Dan Ramos** called the Club's attention to the need, and Rotarians responded by donating \$300 out of their pockets on the spot. This amount was then matched by the Club itself, with \$600 being donated to the family. These are funds, separate from the GoFundMe campaign and are to be used for meals and comfort.



We started Amnesty Fun & Games with the original West Sacramento Rotary Game, "The Two Davids", this time playing with **Judy Ratley** and **Marty Garozzo**. 




What is an "Anniversary Dinner"? Do I buy the President a gift? Why does anyone care what I'm wearing?
