January 13th Program: Danielle Wogulis Yolo Conflict and Resolution Center

The Yolo Conflict and Resolution Center (YCRC) serves all of the Yolo County, providing services with conflict resolution and mediation services. Their primary goal is to help empower residents of Yolo County to turn a conflict situation into a positive opportunity of growth and change. This organization takes their mission one step further beyond their direct services, providing resilience building workshops to communities all over the area. These events have been proven to be effective, and helping the YCRC promote and work towards facilitating large scale, community conversations that promote the entire mediation and resolution process.

The YCRC is piloting their Youth Diversion Program, and holds a contract with the Davis Unified School District and the Davis Police Department, helping youth with conflict resolution services and mediation techniques. This program targets juvenile youth, usually first time offenders, and students with discipline problems in school. Their long term plan is to infiltrate the Youth Diversion Program into all the cities in Yolo County. This program also works with the schools to train staff in resolution justice training. This program has worked wonders in teaching youth "how to listen, and how to work together, starting in Kindergarten," said Wogulis.




