Program: Vocational Visit—Design with Fire Glass Blowing



The Mighty Rotary Club of West Sacramento went on the road for a vocational visit to a lesser recognized business, Design with Fire. Members and guests learned about the fine craft of glass blowing. Linnea Wong explained that glass is used throughout the

world in many different products including cell phones. Witness glass being blown is an opportunity to appreciate glass in a different way. Linnea's studio is also used for teaching. She offers classes including glass bead and jewelry making. The main highlight of the visit came when Linnea with Patrick Mullen demonstrated the difficult process of making Venetian glass. This process was only introduced to the United States in the late 1960s, early 70s. It's difficulty is due to the extreme thinness of the glass. In addition, it requires two experienced glass makers to handle the item. The team of Linnea and Patrick went through the process of making a goblet. The glass is constantly put back into the oven at 2100 degrees to keep the material pliable. Design with Fire has been a well kept West Sacramento secret whose art will spread throughout the region.

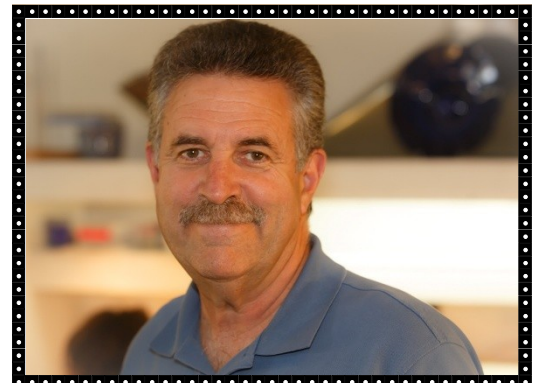

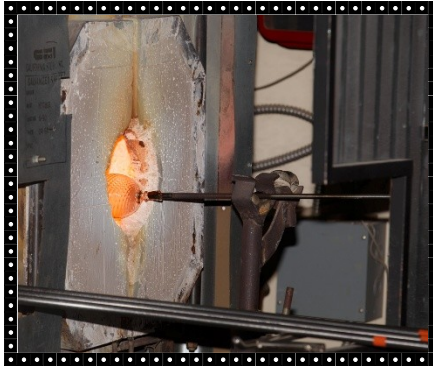

Patrick Mullen demonstrates the art of glass blowing as he forms a portion of a goblet.

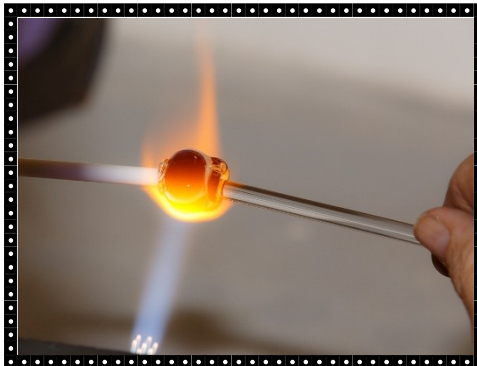


**FUTURE ROTARIAN:
