October 28th Program: Steve McCready Psychotherapist and Life Coach

Steve McCready, psychotherapist, told an interesting story to the "Friday troublemakers," McCready joked, of the Rotary Club of West Sacramento at Club Pheasant. The story of Mike, by definition the prime example of a successful man, was growing increasingly unhappy with his "great and special life", as McCready described it, with a great job, a beautiful wife, and a nice home, and it sent him into a spiral of drinking and depression. Many members and guests around the room, looking at each other, had the same look on his face, "Man, why wasn't *THIS* guy happy?" Well, Steve McCready not only the answer, but how to fix it, along with a good solution and tips for all people......

Many individuals deal with unhappiness or pain, in some form or another, by distraction. The television, video games, and the internet are all good options for this. However, according to McCready, studies show that there is "less brain activity when watching TV than when you're asleep." Or, another option is eating and/or drinking. Either way, these distractions can take away from the connections you make with your family and friends. So what does one do to fix their situation?

McCready was quick to remind us that "we are all human, we all have a brain, so we all struggle" from time to time. The human brain has an amygdala, or "lizard brain," which is responsible for keeping us alive and watches for threats. This "lizard brain" is continuously scanning our environment, finds these threats, and dictates a response from the body, seeing no shades of gray, but only things in black and white. While it is a good thing to be alive and safe, this "lizard brain" is prone to false positives, not always seeing full picture at times. Here is where our "prefrontal cortex" part of the brain comes into play. This "super computer," a term McCready used to describe this part, is not as fast, and it "pauses and shifts into observer mode" and "doesn't have to act." McCready demonstrated the effect of these two different parts of the brain in an couple of exercises, using T-Bird Troy as a perfect specimen of a volunteer.

On that note McCready ended his presentation with a challenge to everyone in attendance: "What are you keeping to yourself that could better help the world?

Before, people would go into these establishments in search of restroom facilities, and would often become customers of the business as well. With the public restroom being installed, people avoided using the facilities in the large department stores, causing their sales to decline.
