Program: Cherie Schroeder, Foster Parenting



Cherie Schroeder has been actively involved in Foster Care since 1985. She knows first hand the influence that a caring adult can have in raising a child. Cherie emphasized how difficult it is for a child entering into the foster care system. In many cases, a child is removed from everything familiar to them.

The child enters into a new home, different town, and leaves The foster care system tries to minimize the friends behind. disruptions as much as possible. Foster care tries to keep the child within Yolo county, but at times a child is placed with family members outside of the county. More children are currently are being placed with families than in group homes. This has led to an increase in the high school graduation rate and more foster children going to college. A foster parent is able to leave a life legacy with the children who are helped. A foster parent is able to cherish a child and give them self confidence. Age does not matter, older adults do not need to bring a child into their home to help. They may be able to provide transportation to the children to and from school, doctor appointments, or other needs. The goal of the foster program is to reunite a child with their immediate family. Sometimes it is just not possible. The foster program is never short of children in need of a loving family.




