



## Vocational Talk– Quirina Orozco

“Wow, if you missed Friday’s meeting, you missed a great one...” said the excited editor of *Chips from the Buzzsaw*, the award-winning publication of the Mighty Rotary Club of West Sacramento. Friday’s meeting was special with two speakers for the price of one- our own **Deputy District Attorney and Vice-Mayor of West Sacramento, Quirina Orozco**, delivered a vocational talk that grabbed the attention of our club from start to finish, and **Poncho Padilla**, our friend and a frequent visitor from the Rotary Club of Winters, updated us on the latest in Rotary’s fight to end polio.

Quirina gave us a window into her job at the DA’s office; helping victims navigate the criminal justice system, fighting gangs, prosecuting child and adult sex crimes, and cracking down on nuisance-sales items such as liquor stores that sell crack pipes right at the check-out counter. We were riveted as she shared her stories of working within the criminal justice system; bringing people to justice who have committed absolutely horrible acts against other human beings. Quirina is a real-life *Wonder Woman* and we collectively thank her for her service; clearly above self.

The man with one name, known to most simply as “Poncho”, updated the Mighty Club on the latest in Rotary’s Polio news. Poncho explained that Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 30 years- making incredible progress in the fight to rid the world of it forever. Rotary International, with the help of some very generous foundations, have helped to reduced polio cases by more than 99.9 percent. Poncho has been on the front lines of this fight, at times risking his life to help eliminate polio from the last three countries where it remains endemic and to keep other countries polio -free. Poncho and Quirina are two reasons why we are proud to be part of this great service organization and why Rotary will continue to make an impact locally and throughout the world.

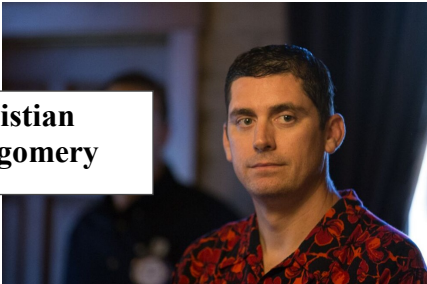

Anthropological evidence shows the native people living in the lake region of the Valley of Mexico traditionally ate tacos filled with small fish. At the time of the Spanish conquistadors, Bernal Diaz del Castillo, documented the first taco feast enjoyed by the Europeans. Hernan Cortes arranged this meal for his captains in Coyoacan. It is unclear why the Spanish used the word taco to describe this native food. One suggested origin is the word *ataco* stuff or to stuff.

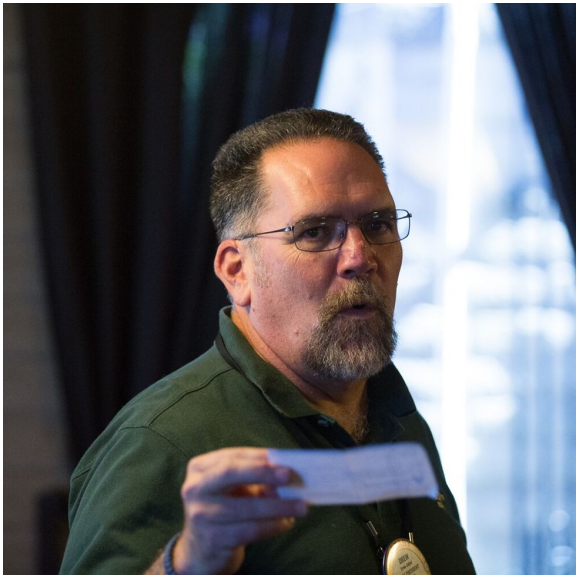

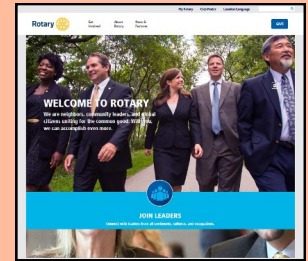
