Along with his label and management company, selling music and collectables of the Baby Boom generation has been added to his motivation in life.

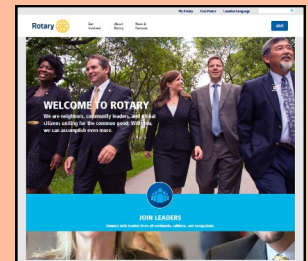
