Rob Strange, Chief of the West Sacramento Police Department, comes from Redding California. He Initially was pursuing a career as a Teacher, but as life happens for so many of us, his career path took a different turn. While in Idaho in college he started in youth corrections. He was really into mentoring and helping youth. Protection and mentorship of youth is what Chief Strange is passionate about. He also serves on the Los Rios Community College Administration of Justice Advisory Board and the Yolo County Child Abuse Prevention Council. Rob also serves on the Invictus Youth Foundation, which helps advance youth and at-risk youth on to better lives.

When there was an opening at the Chief position of WSPD, Rob was appointed as the Interim Chief. The city has 75 Police officers and 30 staff. The West Sacramento Police Department has faced many challenges due to the Pandemic, and the different approaches in Policing In the entire country. Chief Strange believes in being proactive in having the tough conversations to keep the Police force in the city on the forefront of being a modern police force to handle the challenges of the modern world. The issues he feels that are important to the city are Traffic, Homelessness, and Parking. While Parking isn't normally a problem, when it is, it becomes the forefront of issues challenging the city.



OPENING REMARKS: "This Week in History October 16th—October 22nd"

1956 – The two biggest names in 50s Rock and Roll, Bill Haley and the Comets, and Elvis Presley performed on the same bill at Brooklyn High School in Cleveland Ohio

1960 – Dion and the Belmonts split up, Dion staying with Laurie Records, and The Belmonts forming their own record label Sabina Records ultimately reaching #23. It gave producer Phil Spector his only Grammy ... and it was for the sound effects.

1964 – Walking in the Rain, the classic Ronettes ballade, was released today

1966 – The Beach Boys Epic Rock Symphony Good Vibrations charted on its way to number 1, it took Producer Brian Wilson six months to make. It took seventeen sessions at four different studios and cost an incredible \$16,000 to produce

1981 – Sheena Eastons "For Your Eyes Only" theme from the James Bond movie of the same name reached #4, she became the only Bond Theme Vocalist to be seen on screen as she sang during the credits.

1986 – For the first time in Rock history Three Famales held the top three spots on the charts, Janet Jackson for When I Think of You, Tine Turner for Typical Male, and Cyndi Lauper for True Colors
