

Program: Dan O'Brien-BentProp Project



Dan O'Brien is a volunteer with the BentProp Project, an organization dedicated to locating and assisting with the identification American prisoners of war and those missing in action (POW/MIA) from World War II in the region of the Island of Palau in the South Pacific. The organization derives its name from the bent props of airplanes after they crash.

BentProp spends a deal of time just researching the region. Over 200 aircraft were shot down over the island and, in many, the remains of crewman were not recovered. The island consists of dense jungle in the midst of the ocean. By chance, the BentProp Project has teamed up with the University of Delaware, and this has enable them to search the ocean at depths beyond those of individual divers and with greater detail. The search is one that requires great patience. In one case, the team found the initial signs of the wreckage a B-24 bomber. Then it took ten years to find the remains of the crew. Once a crash site was identified, BentProp passed their information on to the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC) for the remains to be recovered. From the B-24 site, eight different sets of remains were recovered and thus bring closure to their families.




