Junior and senior high school students in the Engineering, Science and Technology Academy at River City High School are provided high-quality, work-

based learning opportunities that align with their curriculum.

Through paid internships with local engineering, science and advancedmanufacturing companies, students will be prepared for success in an entry level job and/or post-secondary education. Employers will benefit by having increased access to a local labor pool that has completed industry-relevant academic coursework and has previous on-the-job experience. Interns receive "digital badges", like a modern-day merit badge, to demonstrate their proven competence in skill sets most in demand by today's employers.
