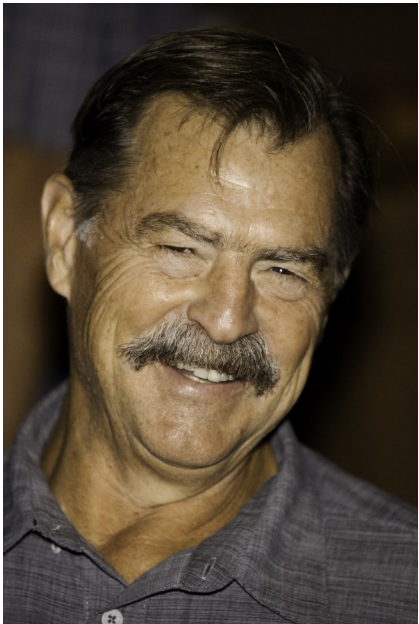

1944 – Denny Laine the original lead singer for the Moody Blues was born, he sang on their first hit Go Now before joining Paul McCartney and Wings.

1966 – The first all female group to top the US charts were The Supremes with Supreme A Go Go

1960 – Elvis Presley, who had been a pet lover for years bought a Monkey, adding to his collection of Mynah Birds, dogs, pigs, chickens, and peacocks

1973 – John Lennon sued the United States Government alleging his phone was tapped while fighting a deportation order.

1983 – In an apparent bad year for the record business, Dolly Parton's duet with Kenny Rogers, Islands in the Stream became #1 and turned out to be the only Platinum selling album of the year.

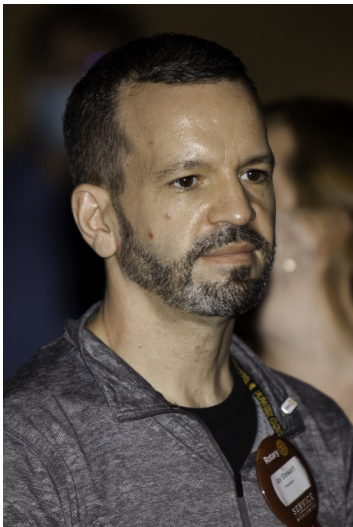

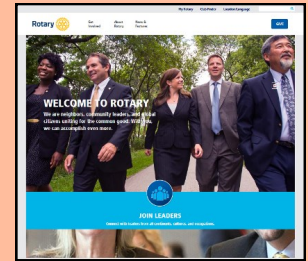
