He began his radio career when he happened to see a post-it note on a computer he walked by that said they were going to hire a DJ. He was a DJ and Sports Anouncer for KPAY radio in Chico. This lasted from 1990-1993. He then moved up the ranks to Talk 650 KSTE where he was a news anchor and morning show producer.

In 1996 Pat became known as “The Sports Guy Pat Walsh” in the mighty 1530 KFBK. He has been named “Sacramento’s Best Sports Broadcaster” Numerous times by Sacramento Magazine. During this time he was always asking the numerous Program Directors at KFBK about getting his own talk show. His perseverance and dedication paid off when the new Program Director asked him if he knew anyone that wanted to host a talk show. Pat jumped on the chance and then he had his own show. He doesn’t stick to one subject or discuss a lot of politics on his show like so many other shows. He sees his position in radio as a companion for the thousands of listeners. He keeps his content fresh and interesting. When asked if he would let the station management dictate what he discussed on his show, he answered absolutely not.

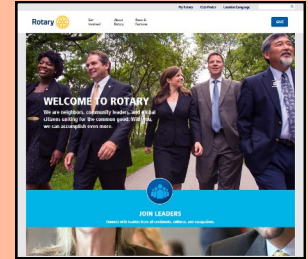
