HISTORICAL EVOLUTION OF CLUB AND FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS –

Average scholarships 1994 to 2006 was \$6,915 paid with funds from annual dues. Tom Wallace started by transferring checking \$35k in checking to investment in 1996

Bob Collins and team formed Foundation on 3/27/98 – **2018 IS OUR 20TH YEAR ANNIVERSARY AS A FOUNDATION!!!!**

First fundraiser campaign 2002 – started at \$35k and our goal was to reach \$100k for endowment for scholarships – that goal was achieved in 2003

Second fundraiser campaign was launched in 2010 – we started at \$230k and our goal was to increase the endowment to \$500k – that goal was achieved in 2014

Current fundraising campaign launched 2016 – we started at \$540K and are currently at \$659k (ye 6/30/18)

Total Donations from inception to 6/30/18 - \$630,590, Total Investments in the Foundation at 6/30/18 - \$659,607

Began issuing Foundation scholarships in 2006 – total scholarships to date \$309,045 (including this year which will be \$31,500)

FOUNDATION BOARD OF DIRECTOR FUNCTION

ADMINISTRATIVE OVERSIGHT – The newly formed Foundation has created Policy Guidelines which are reviewed with Director over site to ensure that funds donated to the Foundation will be invested and disbursed pursuant to wishes of the donor. Policies for the Foundation include:

- 1) Endowment Investment;
- 2) Scholarship Disbursement Guide;
- 3) Investment Guidelines and;
- 4) Gifts and Security Value Measurement

TRANSPARENCY - Foundation reports annually to IRS & California Secretary of State annually. The tax returns filed are public information. All Directors receive a copy of the filed tax returns. In addition, all Directors have 24 hour access to view Investment & Cash Accounts.

FOUNDATION MISSION - “To Provide Scholarships and other support to Individuals in the West Sacramento Community”. (Although the primary emphasis is Scholarships, the Foundation has received funds used specifically for other purposes such as Sponsorship of Presidents International Convention and local projects).

FOUNDATION MOTTO – “DREAM to make a difference in the lives of young people; GIVE generously to advance educational opportunities for our future leaders; ACHIEVE a legacy in your community”. This has been incorporated in our letterhead and Certificates.

NEED - Cost for education continues to rise. Assistance through Scholarship helps.

AVAILABILITY - Non Profit Organizations are having difficulty raising money – results in fewer Scholarships in Community.

EFFECIENCY - 100% of money stays in Foundation...no admin expenses.

PRIDE – West Sacramento Rotary Foundation - This is YOUR Foundation

TAX DEDUCTION – Our Foundation is a 501 C 3 Not for Profit recognized by IRS as tax deductible

LOCAL – All Scholarships are given locally

HISTORY – The West Sacramento Club has been giving out scholarships for over 50 years

LEGACY – \$25k Donors will have scholarships issued in Donors Designated Name

RECOGNITION – Donors giving \$1k or more will be recognized (similar to Paul Harris)

EASY – Many ways to give – Cash, Secure Corporate Grant, Estate Planning, Pledge.

**DRINKING WATER FOR ESCUELA SANTA TERESA DE JESUS
NUEVA CAPITAL, TEGUCIGALPA, HONDURAS**

International Partners

Problem:

- Approximately 1,000 to 1,200 school children in school without drinking water meeting standards
- The children are between the ages of four and seventeen with poor sanitation facilities
- They stay in school from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm to escape violence and engage in studies and activities

Solution:

- Replace existing storage tank of 600 gallons with a reinforced concrete tank of 30,000 gallons
- Include chlorination system and filtration, as appropriate, and rehabilitate sanitation facilities
- Estimated cost is about \$40,000

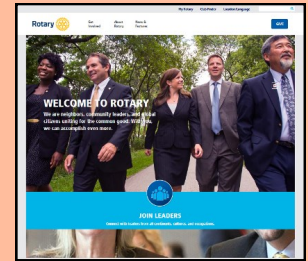

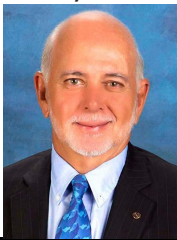
