



Ron Lawrence— Citrus Heights Police Chief by Tom Wallace

Ron Lawrence, Citrus Heights Police Chief, spoke to us from the standpoint of his position as the President of the California Police Chiefs Association rather than as police chief of his community. He spends a lot of time in the state capitol dealing with the effects of state propositions regarding such things as defining felonies vs. misdemeanors. Example: Raising the definition of a misdemeanor to any amount less than \$950 (regarding a robbery) means that many robbers can't be held by the police. He explained that the proposition method of making laws is flawed because there is no rational discussion of pros and cons, whereas, when proposed legislation is introduced in the legislature, the pros and cons can be debated. He discussed homelessness, interaction with ICE, body cams, law regarding bail, etc.

Chief Lawrence has been employed by a number of communities in northern California, including West Sacramento, as he has risen in rank. He clarified that going from one community to another was not because he couldn't hold a job. He was a very smooth and knowledgeable speaker. He knows how to tie a tie so it has a decent looking knot, as opposed to the look achieved by most of the men on Fox News—particularly **Tucker Carlson**, who should be ashamed of the way his ties look. I could go on and on about this particular subject, as it really steams me when I think about it, which I am right now.

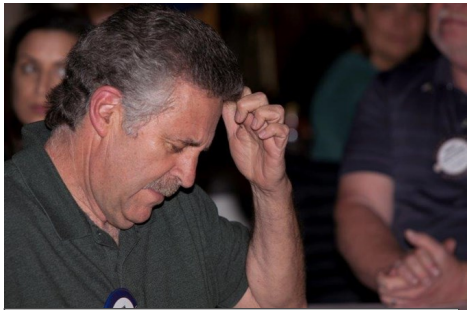

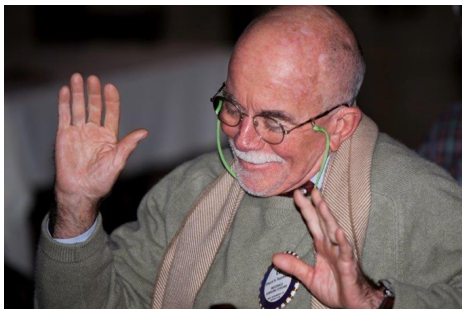

Opening Remarks From Friday's Meeting

National Bootlegger's Day on January 17th recognizes an era when bootleggers became legendary.

January 17 is the birthday of Templeton Rye Whiskey, bootlegger Al Capone and the son of another bootlegger, Meryl Kerkhoff.

The earliest use of the term bootlegger was during the 1880s in the Midwest when one would conceal flasks of liquor in their boot tops when going to trade with Native Americans.

The term found its permanent place in the American vocabulary when Congress passed the Eighteenth Amendment prohibiting the manufacture, transportation, and sale of alcohol in 1920.

Despite now being illegal, thirsty Americans still had a demand for liquor. While some distilleries switched their production to something legal, others took to bootlegging.

Bootleggers helped fill the demand by smuggling various brews from Canada and Mexico, and later distilling their own liquor in backwoods and secluded areas. They brought their loot back to sell to speakeasies, individuals and other establishments.

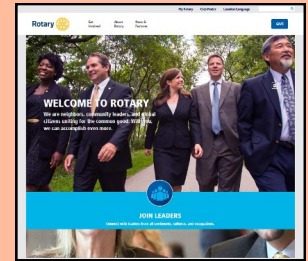
