
February 10th Program: Ed Crane "The Liberty Playbook", New Member Induction, and RYE Excitement





What Starts in a Dorm Room?

Control your minds, people. We're not talking about mold or other stuff.

In January 1946, Renán Domínquez, son of a charter member of the Rotary Club of Mérida, Mexico (about 150 miles west of Cancun) was one of the first recipients of Rotary Foundation scholarships to college graduates to nurture understanding or other nations and cultures.

He slept in a hammock in his dorm room, but marveled that other students didn't fall out of their beds. Rotary also arranged for a summer internship in the UN water supply segment studying dams around the world.



This clash of cultures, along with the challenge of understanding American football, was the beginning of a life of Rotary service.

Now 90 and living in Concord, CA, Renán spent his career as a structural engineer, designing buildings so they wouldn't fall down. (Bill, have you considered that as a goal?) His Club honored him in 2013 by establishing a scholarship program in his name to fund RYE students' exchange expenses.
