

This rest station will be a "community asset," bringing together the local government, local businesses, and community members in a team effort to provide a variety of amenities. These planned amenities include: a water station, a bike fix station, shade structures, a community table and farm stand, active play features for children, and tables, chairs, and umbrellas. Assemble Sacramento is planning to complete the project in 2017, and are already mobilizing fundraising efforts for this project.






