Rocko DeLuca Athletic Director, UC Davis

This week our Speaker was Rocko DeLuca, the Athletic Director for the UC Davis Aggies. Rocko was selected as the UCD Athletic Director in March of 2021. He has been with the UC Davis Athletic Department since 2016. During his time at UC Davis he has been a major factor in their success in fundraising. He earned a Bachelors Degree in Kinesiology from Colorado in 1999, and a Master's degree in sports administration from Northern Colorado in 2001.

UC Davis has 25 Varsity Teams (16 women's and 9 men's) UC Davis students voted over 20 years ago to move into the highly competitive Division 1. There are currently over 650 Aggie Athletes whos combined GPA is 3.16 with 63 at 4.0. Overall 421 posted at least a 3.0 GPA with women's cross country at 3.48. 37 Fall athletes earned Big West Conference All-Academic Team honors. The Academics performance of the Student Athletes of UC Davis is far and above the average of the conferences in which they participate. They aren't just taking underwater basket-weaving and sandbox either with over 30% participating in STEM majors which is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. This is more than double the percentage of the STEM majors in the conferences.

Some fall athletic successes include the Aggie Football reaching the NCAA FCS playoffs for the second time. Men's Water Polo advancing to the NCAA Semi-finals for the first time since 1996, and the Women's Cross Country winning their third Big West Championship. All while maintaining a very high standard of academic performance.

Also happening is the construction of a new 55,000 Square Foot Athletics Center. Named the Edwards Family Athletic Center it boasts a brand new UCDH Sports Medicine Clinic.

We'd like to thank Rocko for coming to share the successes of the UC Davis Athletic Program with the club and we wish him continued success.




