Western United States...or Yolo County, sorry, Wild Bill lost me for a second as I was thinking to myself, "Hmm, I think I'll have the fish & chips today ... ") West Sacramento's 750,000 square foot facility handled 4 million pieces of mail last Friday and, according to Wild Bill, "That was a light day." Our West Sac facility manages mail from Lake Tahoe to Fairfield and from the Oregon border to Bakersfield. Bill and Aaron showed us how the mail gets sorted and explained all of the amazing automation which makes it possible for 4 million pieces of mail to get where it was intended, with ease. From Optical Character Recognition capable of reading my thirdgrade-level penmanship on the front of a letter to biohazard sniffers that "sniff" the mail for anthrax, it was an amazing tour. Well done David!


