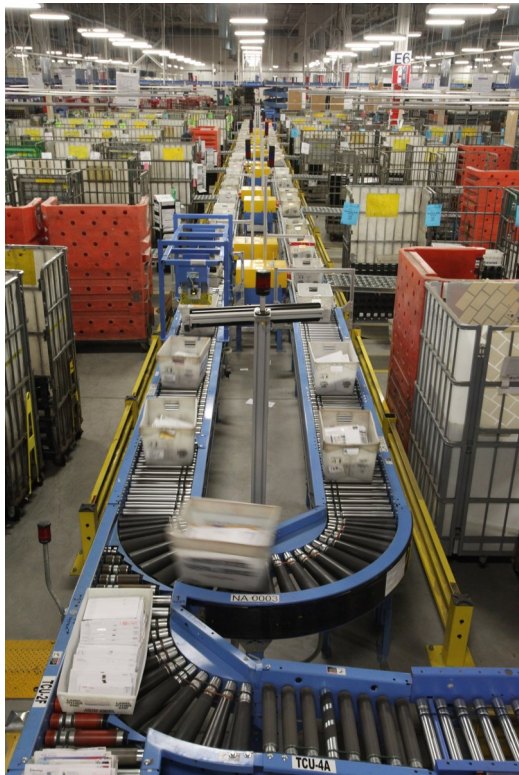


## Vocational Visit- US Post Office

Neither rain, nor sleet, nor snow, nor hail shall stay these couriers from delivering the mail...but the Mighty Rotary Club of West Sacramento certainly slowed 'em down a little last Friday as **David Santiago** organized our first vocational visit of the year. The Club showed up in force to tour West Sacramento's **Main Post Office** on Industrial Boulevard. We were guided through the facility by US Postal Service employees **Wild Bill and his trusty side-kick Aaron**. As the second largest post office in the country, (or maybe the



Western United States...or Yolo County, sorry, Wild Bill lost me for a second as I was thinking to myself, "Hmm, I think I'll have the fish & chips today...") West Sacramento's 750,000 square foot facility handled 4 million pieces of mail last Friday and, according to Wild Bill, "That was a light day." Our West Sac facility manages mail from Lake Tahoe to Fairfield and from the Oregon border to Bakersfield. Bill and Aaron showed us how the mail gets sorted and explained all of the amazing automation which makes it possible for 4 million pieces of mail to get where it was intended, with ease. From Optical Character Recognition capable of reading my third-grade-level penmanship on the front of a letter to biohazard sniffers that "sniff" the mail for anthrax, it was an amazing tour. **Well done David!**

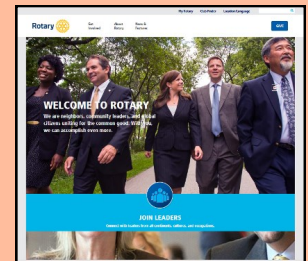
