Patti Palamidessi had the honor of introducing our speaker this week; **Carole Lawson**, CEO and Founder of the **Craft Wine Association** and the Founding Partner/Data Scientist of Creekstone Creative; a data analytics consulting company. She completed her masters work at **Harvard University** in marketing with an emphasis in data analytics. She is also a wine studies graduate of the International Culinary Center and is a Court of Master Sommeliers **Certified Sommelier**.

Carole retired as the Director of eServices under **Governor Schwarzenegger** and then "flunked out of retirement" and decided to reinvent how people see wine. So in 2016, she founded the Craft Wine Association. The Craft Wine Association certifies small production wineries as a Certified Craft Winery and is committed to closing the economies of scale gap the small wineries face very day. She is the force behind the mission, "To make craft wine as available in the marketplace as craft beer and spirits." To that end, this editor approves her mission and wishes her tremendous success in achieving that goal...

Carole founded the Craft Wine Association because a friend in a small winery was struggling to make a living and get her wine noticed in a virtual sea of wine brands. With the mantra, "Always take the meeting, and it will lead you to your next opportunity", Carole explained to the Mighty Club how that mantra guided her down life's paths; from retired government employee to founding two organizations and becoming a Certified Sommelier. As a 59 year-old Harvard student living in the dorms, she didn't let much get in her way once she decided she was going to

accomplish a goal.

According to Carole, "The question is not IF I can but HOW. Don't talk yourself out of anything and, always take the meeting!"
