Rattlesnake Removal



Len Ramirez has been in the business of rattlesnake removal for nearly 30 years. He performed his first removal when he was only 14 years old. His services basically involve removing rattlesnakes from a person's home or business, but it includes much more. Len will evaluate the site and point out areas of concern, suggest corrective measures and offer education to help prevent future snake problems. Len most recent removal was

seven snakes under a house in Saint Helena. Snakes were able to enter the crawl space through gaps in the foundation. Len points out that there is a need to eliminate any openings to allow snakes to get into the cool climate of a crawl space. Garages tend to be a common area from which Len is asked to remove snakes. Gaps under garage doors need

to be eliminated to prevent these encounters. Len's largest removal was over 360 snakes from a construction site near Redding. Len appreciates the snakes through education. He does not kill them, but relocates them to a safe area. The spring is when rattlesnakes are most active, and Len recommends that you stay away from the sharp end.


