Jaime Getz took Members through what can be the worst nightmare imaginable for most parents. Her son, Ty, was diagnosed with a rare bone marrow disease, Severe Aplastic Anemia in July 2017. Despite a very tough battle, Ty has never once complained. Daily he recited his mantra, "I Got This".

Ty's display of strength, confidence and determination drove Jaime to want to share his story with all other children embarking on their medical journey. Named after her family, she created G-Force (www.facebook.com/

igotthisgforce/), providing inspiration and strength to all kids admitted to the hospital by supplying them with "I Got This -G Force" embedded on bracelets.

"My son has spent the past year in and out of the hospital, and his resilience and positive attitude has inspired the I Got This - G Force mantra which we hope will inspire other kids to stay strong," said Jaime.
