### Women in the French Foreign Legion?

Where is Myanmar? Where is Burma? Can you really get a shave there?

Answer: the countries are the same; they're between Bangladesh and Thailand on the Bay of Bengal.

Rotary clubs from Redding, CA, and Hawaii have provided medical and dental clinics, training for English teachers, solar lighting systems and water filtration systems in Myanmar over the past few years. This international service was in response to a call for help by Nobel Peace Prize laureate, Aung

San Su Kyi, for her country at the Rotary Global Peace Forum four years ago.

Myanmar is a very poor country, with 35% of its children malnourished. Its ruling military dictatorship until recently kept the country closed off to the rest of the world. Rotary was active in Burma from 1929 – 1977 and because Rotarians embody "service above self", the country is opening up again.







