Prior to founding monigh**and**esign in 1982, Bruce's early work was historic preservation in Sacramento and the north state. The firm originally established worldwide experience in retail and California based historic preservation and later expanded into several types of projects.

He is currently the Urban Design Manager for the City of Sacramento. He has been working on Sacramento's Rails Project for the past 2 years which is a conceptual plan for developing 198 developable acres of the Old Sacramento Railyards area.

Included in the project is a Kaiser hospital facility, Park, a possible MLS Soccer Stadium, residential, commercial and social outdoor areas where the public can enjoy the new scenes around the historic old brick buildings. Residential projections very from concept to concept from 6,000 units up to 15,000 units if necessary. Most of the shopping would be around the old rail buildings. The project encourages and facilitates more bicycle friendly transport as well as walking. Building height will be similar to old town heights to keep with the "Old Town" historic feeling.

There will be lots of tree lined streets and parks that will be wheelchair accessible for those that are mobility challenged. The rails will still be used for travelers, freight, and potentially High Speed Rail Transit.

If accepted, the project could start in the near future. Kaiser could be completed by 2024. For more information, contact Bruce Monighan at bmonighan@cityofsacramento.org.

I've gotten off school for snow days. Lately, there have been days off for floods. But, a mud day??

A few years ago, the mud walls of the Mafi Zongo E.P. Basic School (primary school) in Ghana gave way after severe rainstorms. Remind anyone of Oroville? Students were moved to a thatched-roof shed at a nearby church for safety, but not much learning went on.

The Rotary Club of Ho (Volta region in southeastern Ghana) raised \$15,000 to build a two-classroom, concrete block schoolhouse that opened last summer. Student attendance has increased, as has learning. This is important because, if they aren't in school, Ghanian children end up working (1.8 million children -34% – of children from 5 – 14 are child laborers).

PS—I worked on a construction project in Ghana and it's not even up to Mexican standards. OSHA??


