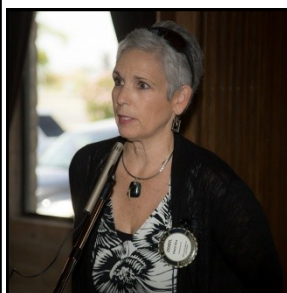

### Program: Charyl Silva and Tim Nicholl, Vaccination and Freedom to Choose



Charyl Silva along with Tim Nicholl presented to the club the need to maintain the option for parents to decide if vaccinating their children was in the child's best interest. Vaccinations have been a hot topic over the last few months due to the Disneyland measles outbreak. The issue has reached the State Capitol with Senate Bill 277 calling for the elimination of a parent's right to exempt their children from

one or all vaccines in order to attend public schools. According to Charyl, today a child is scheduled to receive 69 doses of vaccines for 16 different viral and bacterial illnesses. This is an increase that doubles the number of vaccinations a child received in the year 2000. Our speakers emphasized that the vaccines have possible side effects and that the federal government has exempted pharmaceutical companies from any liability. Charyl and Tim reminded members and guests that the Disneyland measles outbreak did not lead to one death. Individuals need to keep personal choice, and all need to be aware of the decisions that government is trying to control.

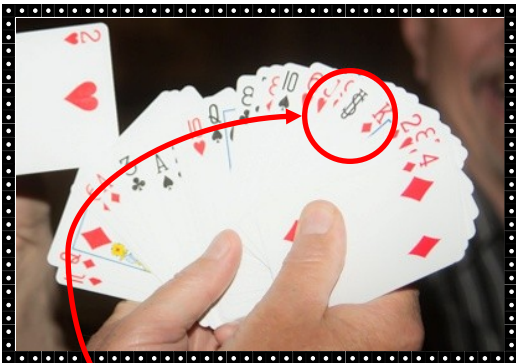
