Interact Clubs are High School Clubs sponsored by a Rotary Club. The Interact name is derived from "INTERnational call to ACTion". The purpose of Interact is to involved youth in service. The first Interact club was chartered in 1962. Today Interact has over 342,953 members in 14,911 Clubs throughout 145 countries. Each club has a board of officers, President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. They are also encouraged to have a Webmaster, Public Image/Media person, Class officers, a Historian, and Volunteer Coordinator. Their officers pretty much mirror those of a Rotary Club. They are required to meet at least twice a month. The key to them having successful meetings are same as Rotary, Make meetings fun and productive, have an agenda and stick to it, begin meeting on time \Box , and ajourn on time. In addition to a Rotary Advisor they should also have a faculty advisor. Rotary advisors need to complete the Rotary Youth Protection program. Rotary has a passionate involvement in the lives of youth through 4 key avenues. Interact, Rotaract (college age), Rotary Youth Leadership Awakening (RYLA), and Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE). Our club has a history of supporting an Interact Club at River City High School, Also we send High School age youth to RYLA each year and have been active in RYE before the pandemic. (RYE is back in action, if any members would like to be the RYE Chair).



OPENING REMARKS: "This Week in History May 14th—June 3rd"

1967 – Aretha Franklin's RESPECT topped the pop charts for two weeks and the R&B list for six, giving Aretha her second million seller

1969 – Pete Townsend of The Who having mistaken a policeman for an overzealous fan was arrested for kicking him offstage at a new York concert. He was fined \$75

1971 – Although Christmas recording was supposed to be the order of the day, after Elvis Tracked "Lead Me, Guide Me" the session went askew when the King, practicing a Karate Kick, knocked one of the Body Guards guns through the guitar of a justifiably distraught session musician.

1973 – Carole King performed a Free concert in New Yorks Central Park for an audience of more than 100,000 fans.

1978 – Donna Summer's Film Thank God It's Friday premiered in Los Angeles

And the number one song in 1973 a rare instrumental Frankenstein by The Edgar Winter Group.

OPENING REMARKS: "This Week in History June 3rd—June 10th"

1962 – The Beatles entered Abbey Road Studios for the first time and recorded four songs. "Love Me Do", "PS I Love You", "Ask Me Why", and Besame Mucho. Although George Martin was supposed to produce, he did not show up until later and the session was actually done by Ron Richards. Martin did not fancy Peter Best's drumming and recommend a session drummer for the actual versions. The group was now officially an EMI act

1963 – Little Miss & the Muffets (originally called the Meltones) topped the Hot 100 with "Chapel of Love". But, thanks to a last minute name change, they became known to the world as the Dixie Cups

1967 – The Monkees' TV Show won and Emmy for Outstanding Comedy Series 1970 – The Who performed their rock-opera Tommy at New York's Metropolitan Opera House

1974 – Sly Stone married Kathy Silva onstage at Madison Square Garden prior to a concert by his group Sly & The Family Stone. The marriage lasted five months 1975 – Olivia Newton John's "Please Mr. Please" charted #3 and becomes her fifth top 10 hit in a row.


1986 – Decca Records A & R head Dick Rowe died today of Diabetes at age 61. Often maligned for passing on The Beatles, he more than made amends by signing Tom Jones, The Moody Blues, and The Rolling Stones. The latter mainly on the strong recommendation of George Martin


