Program: Japanese Delegation: 2015 Walk in U.S.



Kenko Sone, Director of Global Communication for the Japanese Prime Minister's Office, along with a group of Japanese business people, representatives and students joined the Mighty Rotary Club of West Sacramento for lunch on July 24, 2015. The delegation is part of the 2015 Walk in U.S., Talk on Japan program aiming to

strengthen the relationship between Japan and California from a business and cultural level. The group, including fellow Rotarian Mayumi Shiki, Yumi Naruse, Michinori Matsuoka and Shun Yamaya brought a new perspective of who the people of Japan are and what makes up their business culture. Michinori Matsuoka spoke of achievements of Japanese craftsmen that, for centuries and moving into the future, shape global products and innovate through time proven techniques. He gave a story of a company that hand hammered a steel nose to the bullet train that traveled at 342 m.p.h. breaking the speed record. Mayumi Shiki outlined the continued rise of women in the Japanese workforce, highlighting the importance of diversity in culture and business. Yumi Naruse and Shun Yamaya represented the youth of Japan and the compatibility of our distinct cultures. Each brought terms they held dear to our group - "Omoiyari" being an idea about feeling what others are feeling or as Yumi described it, soulfulness, and how it shapes the Japanese mentality. The visit was a great opportunity for members of both groups to connect.



Nigeria Goes One Year Without a Case of Polio

**Excerpt of Note From K.R. Ravindran,
Rotary International President**

Dear Fellow Rotarians,

We're delighted to report that [today] Nigeria has passed one year with no new cases of the wild poliovirus.

This is the longest the country has ever gone without a case of polio and a critical step on the path toward a polio-free Africa. We've come a long way since the bleak years when the virus reached its peak. It was only a decade ago that polio struck 12,631 people in Africa- three quarters of all cases in the world.

We congratulate Rotarians who have donated \$688.5 million to fight polio throughout Africa, including more than \$200 million to Nigeria. We congratulate Rotarians from Africa and around the world who have also devoted countless hours to immunize the children who now have the opportunity for healthier, happier lives.

Rotary and UNICEF team up for WASHing

WASH is an acronym for Water, Sanitation & Hygiene, and the UNICEF program is focused on Central and South America, Africa and Asia, where poor sanitation and a lack of clean water create severe health problems.

Almost half of schools in the least developed countries lack access to adequate water and sanitation facilities. Annually, 272 million school days are lost and 760,000 children die (nearly 2,100 every day) due to diarrhea, according to the World Health Organization. An estimated 400 million school children have intestinal worm infections, which interferes with attendance and learning.


