# Program: Vocational Visit, Firehouse 45



Vocational Service Chair Drew Gidlof led the members and guests to Firehouse 45. There, firemen Damon Nordby conducted a tour of the firehouse and explained the operations that occur on a daily basis. The crew responses to fire, accident and medical emergencies. In addition, they offer public education to schools and other organizations.

The station has two fire engines and two fire trucks. The difference is that a fire engine carries water and hoses and a fire truck carries ladders and tools. The primary fire truck responds to all emergencies. The second truck serves as a back up. The station also responds to emergencies in other nearby areas through "Mutual Aid" agreements. Brenden McTighe and Kris Jower updated everyone on the latest instructions on CPR. The most important step in CPR is to make sure 911 is called. They emphasized that compression rate of 100 per minute



can be established by thinking of the song "Staying Alive." The tour ended abruptly due to the crew being sent out on a emergency call.


### VOCATIONAL CORNER




